## PLEIN AIR: THE ART OF SIMPLICITY WITH MARK FERNANDEZ

Use either oil paints, acrylics, or watercolor or gouache. When painting outside, simpler is better. Bring colors you typically like to use.

Please be familiar with set up prior to class. A chair if you want to sit. You will need to transport your equipment. Keep it light, compact, and easily transportable. Bug spray, sunscreen, hat, water, and a bag lunch. A camera/iPhone/iPad if you want to take photos. iPads/iPhones are great for helping with composition, also for working on your painting back in the studio.

- Sketch book or drawing pad
- Camera/phone
- Pencil (and eraser)
- Container for water/medium
- A view finder

- Container for brushes (optional)

## Oil/ Acrylic Supply List

Here is a suggested limited palette (but bring what you have):

Titanium White, Cadmium Yellow (I use Cad Lemon) Cadmium Red, Alizarin crimson Viridian or Sap Green, Ultramarine Blue Cobalt Blue (optional), Ivory Black

8x10" or 9x12" panels or canvases, no larger than 12"x16"

I highly recommend centurion panels from Jerry's Artarama. They are linen and reasonably priced. Get the less expensive universal primed panels.

## **Brushes:**

I personally like flats and brights, sizes 4,6,8,10 also bring ( if you have ) a larger 1 inch flat brush. My experience is larger brushes can speed the learning curve. A few small rounds or rigger brushes can help with final details. Assorted Palette knives for mixing colors and applying paints.

Odorless solvent for cleaning brushes (I like Gamsol). Air tight container to hold solvent. Water for acrylic painters

A portable easel with a paint palette. I recommend French Easel, Open M box, Alla Prima Easel, to mention a few. The easel needs to be stable in outdoor conditions.

## Watercolor/Gouache List

Paint: Use what you have but my suggestions are:

French Ultramarine, Cobalt Blue, Alizarin crimson, Cadmium red, Cadmium yellow, Raw sienna, Burnt sienna, and Titanium white gouache

**Good paper**, eg Arches and Saunders 140 pound, rough or cold press., 100% cotton. Good paper is the most important supply. You will never learn watercolor on Job Lot paper.

**Brushes:** Mostly rounds with **good points**, a mop, a few flats, riggers.

Watercolor palette Painting Board, white tape Small spray bottle

A portable easel with a paint palette. I recommend En Plein Air Pro Traveler's Series Watercolor Package. The easel needs to be stable in outdoor conditions. Can also bring a chair and table instead.
